

Invitation to participate in an online research conversationOn behalf of Victoria Edwards at the University of Sheffield

I am currently studying towards a PhD in Information Studies at the University of Sheffield's iSchool. The purpose of my research is to explore both library and e-book supplier workflows surrounding the quality management of the bibliographic metadata of e-books and the relationships between these two parties. The research will also examine attitudes towards the value of cataloguing and how this relates to perceptions of roles within the changing environment of the academic library sector. The project also aims to consider communities of practice that key actors are involved in and the structures and norms of these communities. I am inviting senior managers and cataloguing staff from libraries within the M25 Consortium to participate in an online research conversation that will last approximately 45-60 minutes.
